

The Proctors draw the attention of members of the University to the following:

### 3. *Academic Misconduct and Examinations*

The *Rules of Behaviour* make provision in relation to academic misconduct, including plagiarism. Suspected academic misconduct will be investigated and disciplinary action may follow. The General Board has published *Rules* for the conduct of examinations and guidance for candidates, examiners and supervisors; this guidance is supplemented by course-specific guidance published by Faculties and Departments.

Examination candidates are reminded that post-exam disturbance, including littering or damage (especially with food or drink) and obstructing thoroughfares, is prohibited under the *Rules for the Guidance of Candidates and for the Prevention of Misconduct in Examinations* published by the General Board, and that sanctions, including fines, may be imposed.
